#### 1 Introduction

Understanding African Regional Community Courts, their purpose and *raison d'être* requires a bird's eye view of the past and recent macroeconomic developments on the continent. Article 6(1) of the Treaty Establishing the African Economic Community<sup>1</sup> (TAEC) of 1991 describes best what this development entails:

'The Community shall be established gradually in six (6) stages of variable duration over a transitional period not exceeding thirty-four (34) years.'

All essential decisions in order to reach this goal of a continent-wide African Economic Community (AEC) are currently taking place within the framework of different Regional Economic Communities which group together individual – typically neighboring – states in African sub-regions for the purpose of achieving the intended economic integration.<sup>2</sup> Apart from economic cooperation, their Treaties envisage the foundation of suitable Regional Community Courts which are competent to apply the respective community law and accordingly decide on legal disputes arising therefrom.<sup>3</sup> This is where the contribution ties in, namely with the main
